Many things made this a special occasion, not the least one being that Jenneille Martin pictured here with Dame Quentin, Her Excellency the Honourable Sam Mostyn AC and me, was a participant on our first Travel Program back in 2010. We were delighted to have Jenneille attend, this time, as a staff member from Bidyadanga.

Funding and our Principal Partner



Girls from Oz is deeply grateful to our principal partner, the Australian School of Performing Arts (ASPA), for 17 years of consistent, committed support that has ensured the longevity and success of g-oz.

We are extremely fortunate to have the ASPA community, most notably the Australian Girls Choir (AGC) network, regularly and enthusiastically raise awareness and fundraise for g-oz, especially during our annual Giving Circles Campaign. We are especially grateful to Sivaganga Sahathevan OAM who led the Taste of India community in raising \$25,000 in their sixth year of supporting g-oz.

This year's campaign, '100,000 reasons why', saw a total of \$105,230 raised over five weeks. Thank you to the 47 Giving Circle Coordinators and to all of our donors. The ongoing success of this annual campaign continues to impress funders, government bodies and our community stakeholders; and proves the sustainability of this funding model.

Community Programs

Halls Creek, Bidyadanga, Lockhart River and Kowanyama

2024 saw g-oz continue program delivery across four g-oz locations in Western Australia's Kimberley region and Queensland's Far North. g-oz also concluded its programming at Carnarvon Community College (WA) in March after eleven years.

Our 21st Travel Program saw 31 participants in Sydney for a transformative week of new opportunities, rewarding challenges and momentous memories. This included time spent with peer-aged AGC host sisters and their families, workshops at NIDA and Bangarra Dance Theatre, and vocational experiences at Google and Qantas.

Highlights from the year include:

- The girls' performance of Cyndi Lauper's 'True Colours' at the Sydney Opera House as part of the AGC Annual Concert.
- 39 instructors delivering 17 Community Programs that directly reached and positively impacted the lives of more than 600 girls.
- 12 AGC choristers visiting Lockhart River as part of the 'Illuminating Lockhart' Reverse Travel Program where they connected with Lockhart Songman and Cultural Liaison Officer, Simon Butcher, and the Lockhart State School g-oz participants.
- Community and regional performances including the 'Party In The Park' at Kununurra's Ord Valley Muster and a concert at the Lockhart River Social Club.
- Collaborating with language experts in Kowanyama and Halls Creek to translate 'True Colours' into Kokoberra and Jaru for participants to learn and perform.

"As a teacher who went on a Girls from Oz trip, I witnessed the hard work the girls need to put in to be able to put on a show; the commitment they have to give; and the change in them from before and after the show. After the performance they seem to walk more tall [and] hold their heads up high. This is a great thing for Aboriginal children...Thank you."

Jaru and Kija woman and former g-oz Board Member, Carolyn Polkinghorne, has seen three generations of her family positively impacted by g-oz:

"We need our young girls to be our leaders, to share their stories, to have a voice, to challenge the things that are unfair, unequal, the inequity that we face living in a small, remote community and that's what Girls from Oz gives to them...there's something special about this program."



Carolyn attended the very first Travel Program, as a staff member of Halls Creek District High School, with her eldest daughter, Kaite, as a participant. Carolyn has since witnessed her younger two daughters, Skye and Zoey, enjoy a similar opportunity as they attended the 2024 Travel Program, performing beside each other at the Sydney Opera House.

Carolyn's granddaughter and Kaite's daughter, Isla, is now at school in Halls Creek and an enthusiastic young g-oz participant. We hope she will be able to enjoy the same rewarding experiences as her grandmother, mother and aunties in coming years!
